RESTORATION

Path of Hope

This month we welcomed three new survivors into safety at Path of Hope. While we faced a difficult moment when thieves attacked the shelter, we praise God that the girls were unharmed. Our guard sustained injuries but is expected to recover. Even in the face of adversity, we remain steadfast in our mission to protect and restore lives. **\$500 is our urgent need in order to add more security on the compound.**

PREVENTION

Reclaiming Hope

Reclaiming Hope continues to teach and expand its outreach, currently active in 12 villages. Their consistent presence is helping to strengthen families and communities and bring hope and encouragement.

INTERVENTION

Mukisa Ministries

Each day, around 80 children come to receive breakfast, ensuring they start their mornings with nourishment and care. This month we dedicated time to conducting home visits for many of these children, strengthening relationships with families and gaining deeper insight into their needs. These visits have been an important step in supporting the well-being of the children beyond the daily program.

INTERVENTION

Assist. Resettle. Educate.

We thank God that the school term is going well, with 23 students enrolled. Twelve of these children are attending purely in faith, trusting the Lord to provide sponsors for their education. We urgently invite you to prayerfully consider becoming one of the 13 sponsors needed. We rejoice that Khatiya was admitted and welcomed by Amazima, and we celebrate Vincent's success in completing Senior 6 as he pursues his calling to become a secondary school teacher.

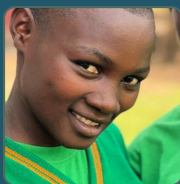

Rebecca lives with her Grandmother and 2 brothers in extreme poverty. She is a day scholar in order to care for her family.

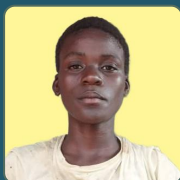


Joseph Wafula

Joseph lives with his Grandmother, brother and sister in extreme poverty. He is a day scholar in order to care for his grandmother.



Job Kalikodi

Class: Primary 6

Fees: Day \$20 per month or \$240 per year

Job lives with his mother and 6 other siblings in extreme poverty. He is a day scholar in order to help out at home.



Abwali Jude

Class: Primary 5

Fees: Day \$20 per month or \$240 per year

Jude lives with his disabled father in extreme poverty. He is a day scholar in order to be helpful to his family at home.



Khatiya Eliya

Class: Senior 1

Fees: \$83 per month or \$1000 per year

Khatiya is the oldest in his family and has been raising the younger siblings. He got accepted to a prestigious school and wants to be a doctor someday.



Wamwaya Martin

Class: Primary 5

Fees: Boarding \$50 per month or \$600 per year

Martin is Khatiya's younger brother. He is a bright boy and despite only starting school in 2024, he has progressed quickly through grades. He is in boarding school in order to have oversight and safety.



Wanyakala James

Class: Primary 3

Fees: Boarding \$50 per month or \$600 per year

James is Khatiya's younger brother. He is in boarding school in order to have oversight and safety.



Nabulo Peace

Class: Primary 4

Fees: Boarding \$50 per month or \$600 per year

Peace was working as a child slave in her family's bar before being placed in school in 2024. She tries hard to understand her teachers and was baptised recently after giving her life to Christ!



Kasoga Amina

Class: Primary 6

Fees: Boarding \$50 per month or \$600 per year

Amina was recently reunited with her mother after being passed around to relatives her whole life. She is in boarding school to relieve her mother who lives in poverty.



Namanda Thuwaiba

Class: Senior 4

Fees: Day \$20 per month or \$240 per year

Thuwaiba lives in a very disorganized and chaotic polygamous family. She goes to day school in order to be able to check on her siblings.



Masaba Ronny

Class: Primary 5

Fees: Day \$20 per month or \$240 per year

Ronny lives with his father and step mother and has a habit of running to the streets when things get tough at home. Ongoing counselling is improving family unity.
